# Museum Spring Outing to Jasper House June 27, 2010 from 12-4 pm. JYHS members only

The 2010 museum outing is Sunday, June 27at Jasper House, one of Jasper National Park's four National Historic Sites. The trip to Jasper House is a bit of an adventure but we hope to see many members make the trek. We'd like to encourage as much carpooling as possible. Please call Karen at 852-3013 if you can offer or need a ride.





As usual we will set up a tent with coffee and goodies. Please bring your own lawn chair, mug and water bottle. Sunscreen and insect repellent would also be a good idea The only "facility" is the outhouse at Devona Cabin, about a km. from our tent-watch for the LAST CHANCE sign. Directions:

On Highway 16 drive east of Jasper and turn off at the Snaring campground road. Follow that road past the Ewan Moberly buildings, the Snaring warden station, through the gate at Corral Creek and continue about 11 kms. until you see the JYHS outing sign indicating the turnoff through a gate to the Devona Warden cabin. Follow the signs past the cabin to the clearing by the railway tracks (approx 4 kms.). We'll set up our tent there. Later, people who are capable of the 20 minute walk to Jasper House will explore the site as a group. The trail is NOT maintained but will be marked.

Celestine Lake Road is rough and winding and is one-way so you must follow the in and out times. We will have the Devona gate open at 11:15 and close it at 4:15. Please plan your trip in between 11 an 12:00 and head out between 3:30 and 4:30 and carpool if possible.

## Mystery Object

## Archives





New to the Archives

In March of 2010 the archives received a small bundle of old postcards generously donated by historical society member, Keith Spencer, a past president of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada. The bundle of postcards included some interesting images of early Jasper/Fitzhugh including an image of one of the cabins at the GTP engineer's camp at mile 113 back in the day (presently Snape's Hill).

These early postcards were often taken by amateur photographers that were equipped with a camera, such as the Kodak Brownie, which allowed for the average photographer to create a postcard camera negative and even place identifying words on it (usually in white print) and then have it printed on a divided back postcard stock (divided back postcards date from March 1 1907 – 1915, often known as the golden age of postcards).

Postcards created by professional photographers or companies usually had copyright information or the photographers name written on the front of the image or on the reverse side. One of the postcards donated by Mr. Spencer, appear to have been created on a personal camera. It is titled, "No Name Mt. Jasper Park." I am putting out the challenge to our members to put on their sleuthing hats and see if we cannot locate this mountain and perhaps find out if it has since been named.




